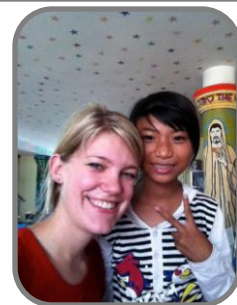




God be gracious to us and bless us, And cause His face to shine upon us- That Your way may be known on the earth... Psalm 67:1-2 NASB

God opened doors and answered prayers so that on March 15th-25th, Master Plan was able to send our second team to Sway Pak, (near Phnom Penh) Cambodia to partner with Agape International Mission (AIM). The Lord has called us to “go into all the world and make disciples” and to “love your neighbor as yourself”. These are the very things that we are eager to do, and encourage Denver students to do as well. More than enough students applied to go, and God raised the all the money needed for the trip just in time! I was able to take 8 students on this trip, and Laura bravely stayed stateside with our three preschoolers. Married seniors Aaron and Korina were trip leaders “in training” as well. - Cambodia is on the Western border of Vietnam
- Only 3.3% of Cambodians are Christians, over 80% are Buddhist
- It’s one of the world’s poorest countries (income/person/year \$823)
- Sway Pak is a major hot spot for child sex trafficking by westerners

Our whole team was able to lend different skills to the children and young adults of a Sway Pak neighborhood through a local church called Rahab’s House. Each day the students and I taught the Bible, guitar, piano, computer classes, led a bible training study for the students who help lead the church, helped lead kids club (over 100 kids at “Vacation Bible School”), helped run the medical clinic, and helped reach the men (many pimps) in the community by serving at the "Lord's Gym". **All this was done in the neighborhood known as the epicenter of the child sex trafficking industry in Cambodia.** At the end of the week, about 20 of our new piano and guitar students played and sang "How Great is our God" together several times in our classroom which used to be a child brothel! Talk about redemption! We also gave out over a hundred Cambodian gospel tracts all over the city. We praise God that Aaron helped to prevent a western sex tourist from buying a young girl in our hotel lobby by calling the child protection cops. We also thank God for our student Nolana getting out of the hospital in about 24 hours from heat exhaustion! Thanks for all your prayers and support! God used your part to bless us and many Cambodians!
