Every Friday night this semester we've had students over for dinner followed by a discussion about any question they bring up. Since our campus is the biggest campus in Colorado and largely a commuter campus, community is very hard for students to come by. This is one reason these **Friday night dinners** have been so successful; it gives students an opportunity to interact with each other. But not only do the student grow in their relationship with each other, they grow in their understanding of Scripture. We take every question back to what the Bible has to say. This provides a safe and truthful atmosphere for the students to ask the questions that have them struggling like, "How do we really know homosexuality is wrong?", "Why does God allow people to suffer", "How should we respond to persecution on facebook and in classes?"
